1. Approval of the agenda

The agenda was approved.

2. Approval of the minutes from the last meeting (Annex 1)

The minutes from meeting 82 were approved.

3. Approval of the educational framework and exam schedule for PHSSpring and Summer 2025 (Annex 2)

The educational framework and exam schedule for PHS were approved with a few comments:

Clara Appel asked about the class instructions for the course SFOB20008U Epidemiologi 2. There are 78 students being taught in the same class. Signe Jervelund noted that there are two teachers present during the classes. Signe will ask the course responsible how it works.

Signe Jervelund commented that the number of teaching hours for the course SFOK23008U Migration, diversity and health should be 40 instead of 30 (due to 10 ECTS). Additionally, the number of teaching hours for the course SFOK24001U Mixed methods in Public Health should be 20 instead of 25 (due to 5 ECTS). AUS will follow up with the course responsibles.

4. Approval of the educational framework and exam schedule for GH – Spring and Summer 2025 (Annex 3)

The educational framework and exam schedule for GH were approved with a few comments:

Julie Miller noted that the course SGLK23005U Geo Information in Disaster Situations appears in the GH educational framework, but the students cannot for some reason take the course. AUS will follow up.

It was approved that the language for the course SFOK24001U Mixed methods in Public Health is English.

6. Discussion of courses to be offered for Summer 2025

There are no new summer courses in the pipeline. The study board wants the summer course SGLK22001U Creating Healthy Cities to continue.

8. Orientation from the student group

a) Global Health

Global Health study track

The students have made a survey about the study track process and shared it with their fellow students. It has been a frustrating process. Several students have had courses approved that they later found out they couldn't take. Overall, it has been very difficult to find courses.

The students requested an overview of the courses they can take.

In collaboration with AUS, Jane Sørensen will look into what can be done with the study tracks.

Julia Miller will check up on whether there are still students who lack courses for their track and forward the information to Tove Pedersen (AUS).

AMEE conference

New bachelor's students

The new bachelor's students have had a good start to their studies. They have just returned from their 'rustur'.

a) Britt Tersbøl (Jane Sørensen made the orientation)

New Global Health students

The new Global Health students are having introductory days these days. There are 47 new students enrolled in the program. The students come from 20 different countries, about 20% from non-EU countries. They will start having classes next week (week 36).

Minimum grade point average

The minimum GPA for entering the bachelor's program in PHS under quota 1 has increased from 8.9 in 2023 to 9.4 in 2024.

Electives

Signe Jervelund mentioned that she recently attended a management board meeting where it was discussed that the electives for Health Informatics, Global Health and Public Health Science could be shared.

Currently, the idea is to select 10 themes for the electives, with some themes dedicated to each program, but with a lot of overlap. All courses would be offered to all students in the three programs.

Signe Jervelund encouraged the students to consider relevant themes (not topics) and send them to her by September 9th.

New advisory boards at SUND

The advisory boards at SUND will change from January 1, 2025. There will be an advisory board for the public health area consisting of the programs Public Health Science, Health Informatics, Global Health, Master of Disaster Management and Master of Public Health.

Signe Jervelund asked the members of the study board to consider specific names or positions they would like to have in the new advisory board. The study board will discuss this further at the study board meeting in September.

10. Discussion and approval of sharper criteria for admission to the PHS MA program (Annex 5 – Annex is in Danish)

Signe Jervelund presented a draft of sharper criteria for admission to the master's program in Public Health Science.

The study board decided that the courses 'Sundhedsøkonomi' and 'Intervention og evaluering' should not be included under specific course requirements.

The study board approved the draft. The study board also had suggestions for additional text that could be included to help potential applicants. The education coordinator has sent these suggestions along with the approved draft to the admissions department at AUS.
